

TIRE RECYCLING

The Municipality of Grey Highlands has partnered with Ontario Tire Stewardship to provide *FREE* tire recycling at all our Waste Disposal Sites!



Did you know that...

- Over 12 million tires are sold every year in Ontario
- Recycling four tires can save the energy equivalent of 18 gallons of gasoline and reduces greenhouse emissions by 146 kg (323 lb) of CO₂
- Four tires can be recycled for free at the Municipality of Grey Highlands Waste Disposal Sites
- Your old used tires can be turned into new green products

How do you recycle your tires?

The Municipality will accept four tires per visit to your waste disposal site for free to be recycled by OTS.

Bring four tires of any size with the *rims removed* to your waste disposal site for free recycling. It is regulated that we cannot accept tires from businesses in Grey Highlands. We encourage our businesses to register with Ontario Tire Stewardship for their own collection of tires.

CONGRATULATIONS TO EVERYONE WHO HAS PARTICIPATED IN THE PROGRAM!

To date 4,068 tires have been diverted from Grey Highlands landfill sites.

ONTARIO TIRE STEWARDSHIP (OTS) PROGRAM

What happens to old tires in Ontario?

Ontario Tire Stewardship is an Initiative that responsibly recycles scrap tires, turning them into useful products, creating investment, new green jobs, and driving innovation in Ontario. OTS helps manage the tire life cycle- from purchase and collection to recycler manufacturer- ensuring tires in Ontario help our economy and environment.

In one year, Ontarians exceeded the standard for recycling rates in Canada, recycling over 125,000 tonnes of tires or 95% of all tires in Ontario!

Now millions of tires are being diverted from burning and land filling to other uses such as rubber mats, playground products, hockey rinks, automotive part and roads.
